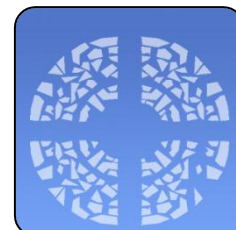

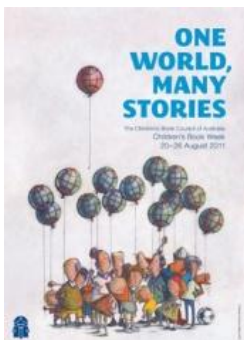

Book Week 20th - 26th August is Children's Book Week.

Every year the community of St. Michael's celebrates Book Week and it is a load of fun! Book Week is the longest running children's festival in Australia, celebrating its 66th birthday in 2011.

This year the theme is – One World, Many Stories.

We fill the week with many special activities to celebrate our love of books. A highlight of the week is our Book Week Parade. All our students are invited to attend school on Tuesday, August 23rd dressed up as one of their favourite book characters. Or because of the theme, One World, Many Stories and our inquiry which is celebrating cultural heritage, students may prefer to come dressed in a national costume.

STUDENT WELLBEING

Student Well Being encompasses the following areas: Student Engagement, Student Connectedness, Classroom Climates, Inclusion and Prevention to Intervention.

As parents our first priority is always the safety and wellbeing of our children. So if our son / daughter came home and said that they felt unsafe at school, this would be cause for concern. As a school community we continue to strive to provide a learning environment that is safe, supportive, engaging and inclusive of all. With the support of clear procedures student, staff and parents are able to confidently report any situation that may be worrying them. Our restorative approach ensures that we have effective methods of behaviour management and that they are consistently applied across the school. They are non-hostile and non-punitive. When talking with our children about "bullies" or being "bullied" it is important that we have a shared understanding of what these terms mean. The following definitions are taken from the **National Safe Schools Framework**. The Framework provides Australian schools with a vision and a set of guiding principles that assist school communities to



take a proactive whole-school approach to developing effective student safety and wellbeing policies.

Bullying - What is it and what it is not.....

Definition for Teachers, Parents and Carers

Bullying is repeated verbal, physical, social or psychological behaviour that is harmful and involves the misuse of power by an individual or group towards one or more persons. Cyberbullying refers to bullying through information and communication technologies. Conflict or fights between equals and single incidents are not defined as bullying. Bullying of any form or for any reason can have long-term effects on those involved including bystanders.

For use with younger students

Bullying is when someone keeps picking on another child again and again and tries to make them feel bad. They say or do many mean and hurtful things, make fun of them a lot, try to stop them from joining in or make others not like them. Although it isn't nice if someone says or does something mean to someone else, we don't necessarily call that bullying. It also isn't bullying if children have a one-off argument.

For use with older students

Bullying is when one student (or a group) keeps picking on another student again and again to upset or hurt them. They might hurt them physically, try to socially isolate them or say and do many mean or humiliating things to them. Although it's neither respectful nor acceptable if someone behaves in a mean or aggressive way on one occasion, it isn't bullying. A fight or disagreement between students of equal power or status isn't bullying.

All student outcomes are improved when schools and families work collaboratively. If you have any concerns about your child's wellbeing we invite you to contact your child's classroom teacher, Geraldine Dalton, John Sandy or myself.
